
BelovED Reads Lit November Book of the Month


Last month, the Elementary School launched a new community literacy initiative: BelovED Reads Lit Book Club. The goal of the book club is to bring our BelovED family together each month to build community, spark conversations, and inspire action, as well as instill a love of literacy in our scholars.

This month's BelovED Reads Lit Book of the Month is Prairie Lotus!

Prairie Lotus is a powerful, touching, multilayered book about a girl determined to find her place and realize her dreams: getting an education, becoming a dressmaker in her father's shop, and making at least one friend. Acclaimed, award-winning author Linda Sue Park has placed a young half-Chinese girl, Hanna, in a small town in the Dakota Territory in 1880. Hanna's adjustment to her new surroundings, which means negotiating the townspeople's almost unanimous prejudice against Asians, is at the heart of the story.

The recommended age for this book is 10 and up, but families with younger students can read this together! We will also be engaging in read alouds for our younger scholars! Some discussions you can engage your child/ren in with this book are:

- Families can talk about how Prairie Lotus shows what it meant to be a minority in the United States in the 1880s. How have things changed? How have things stayed the same?
- In Hanna's world, electricity doesn't light up houses at night, and almost everything is made by hand. What would it be like to depend on your skills to survive? Would you be able to live without your devices for more than a day?
- Hanna and her class are delighted when someone reads aloud in class. Do you like to listen to books being read aloud? Why is having something read aloud different than watching a movie or a show?
